Small group optional guide: The endless pursuit of money

<u>UP; we grow in our love for Jesus through His word and worship</u>

WORD: Luke 12:13-28, 1 Timothy 6:6-10

Consumerism; the endless pursuit of more. Where does it end?

- The Money Charity calculates UK credit card debt is around £2,363/household. Some of us are spending what we don't have to buy what we don't need.
- TikTok or Facebook or YouTube ads tell us 5 sure-fire ways to guarantee wealth. Yet Get Rich quick schemes are just greed repackaged. The kingdom of God is a get rich slow scheme - our rich inheritance is in Christ.

So why did Jesus talk so much about money and wealth?

- 15% of Jesus teaching and 11 of 39 parables
- 1) You can love God, or you love money pick one. Matthew 6:24. Loving money is motivated by greed, God and pursuing God is motivated by love
- Jesus didn't say it was difficult to love God and to love money, he said it was impossible. Pick One.
- 2) Chasing money risks apostasy (losing faith) and a life full of regrets; 1 Tim 6:10 10For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil.
- Money is only a means of exchange, but it takes on the characteristics of the person who owns it.
- 3) The love of money matters, To love money more than God is idolatry and leads back to our slavery to sin.
- 4) The love of money is a sign of the last days; 2 Timothy 3:1-2, 4 (People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money...lovers of pleasure)
- Read the parable of the rich young fool; Luke 12:13-34

The real tragedy is not that the man died prematurely, but that the rich man lived without God and died without God. The seductive lie is - pursue pleasure here and now, because that is all there is. God calls that foolishness.

The disciples had a different issue, worrying that they would have enough, Jesus reassures them that their Heavenly Father knows what they need.

Money is not simply a wealth issue, it's a heart issue.

Let's remind ourselves of some biblical principles about wealth, greed and generosity:

As you sow, you will reap – Galatians 6:7 Give and it will be given to you – Luke 6:38

- 1. Give to God first learn to live out of the rest.
- 2. Be content with what you have
- 3. Be generous and hospitable
- 4. Live simply, don't simply accumulate.

- 7. Steward what God has given you for yourself and others
- 8. Keep spiritual practices Sabbath rest, fasting, tithing
- 9. Remember the poor, particularly fellow Christians
- 10. Follow the Holy Spirit's leading
